
Alphabet Letter Memorizing Trick

The following technique, called **sequential memorization**, is an immensely powerful tool for accelerating the rate in which any student can permanently memorize (learn) the alphabet letters. The technique achieves this high rate of progress by introducing only one new letter along with the previous letter (except for the first two letters "a" and "b," in which both letters are taught simultaneously. The increased repetition of only small amounts of information allows maximum stimulation of brain areas involved in memory retention, thereby dramatically improving the learning rate.



Teacher/Classroom Procedure

STEP 1 – LETTER WRITING PRACTICE - Pass out this sheet to each student in the classroom. Discuss the letters and have students use a pencil and practice writing over the "dotted" letter under teacher's directions. **Discuss the unusual "typewriter a" style which is typically seen in books but is not used in writing.**



STEP 2 – STUDENT ORAL READING - Call on several students to individually read either the top - middle or bottom row of letters below. Tell all students that if a mistake is made to please raise their hand quietly.
STEP 3 – CLASSROOM ORAL READING – Have the classroom read each row of letters together as a group.



STEP 4 – **WRITING PRACTICE and FINAL TEST** – End this activity by having students trace over each letter below. While this is being done, teacher and assistants walk around the room to test students on reading one of the rows above. Place a "smiley face" in the box to the right of each row if read correctly.



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
